On September 9, 1939, Sergeant Clarence Lemuel Maynard was responding to a call for service near Abingdon, Virginia when he became involved in an automobile accident and tragically he succumbed to his injuries. Sergeant Maynard gave his life in the preservation of law and order, and who in so doing lived and died in the best traditions of law enforcement's duty and service to mankind.

Sergeant Clarence Lemuel Maynard became the 8th Virginia State Police Officer to pay the ultimate sacrifice. He is truly a Virginia Hero! His memory lives and his service stands as a model for troopers and law enforcement officers today.
